WHEREAS, the following day, April 19, 1775, marked the Battles of Lexington and Concord, military engagements of the American Revolutionary War, which ignited the struggle for American independence; and

WHEREAS, The events of April 18 and 19th 1775 signaled the urgent call for unity and defense against oppression, a spirit that ultimately culminated in the drafting and adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, which formally articulated the colonies' right to self-governance and enshrined the principles of liberty, self-determination, and unalienable rights that continues to this day to define the American identity; and

WHEREAS, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow immortalized this moment in history through his famous poem *Paul Revere's Ride*, recounting the lantern signal—one if by land, and two if by sea—displayed in the belfry of the Old North Church as a call to arms for American patriots; and

WHEREAS, the significance of light overcoming darkness is a theme deeply rooted in history and faith, and Easter weekend, observed by many as a time of renewal and hope, parallels the *Two Lights for Tomorrow* initiative as a symbol of guiding light, resilience, and the triumph of freedom over oppression; and

WHEREAS, the *Two Lights for Tomorrow* national initiative seeks to honor this pivotal moment in history by encouraging individuals, businesses, and institutions to display two lights in their windows on the night of April 18, 2025, as a symbol of remembrance and unity; and





Gaze at him with a spectral glare,

At the bloody work they would look upon.

It was two by the village clock,
When he came to the bridge in Concord town.
He heard the bleating of the flock,
And the twitter of birds among the trees,
And felt the breath of the morning breeze

Who that day would be lying dead,
Pierced by a British musket-ball.
