**SUPPLEMENTAL LEVY SNAKE RIVER SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 52**

**PERMANENT OVERRIDE LEVY MORELAND CEMETERY DISTRICT**

The Board of Trustees of Snake River School District No. 52, Bingham County, Idaho, is seeking authorization to levy a Supplemental Levy for the following purposes and approximate amount of levy funds to be allocated to each use: (i) Teacher and staff support, recruit and retain staff, \$275,000; (ii) Curriculum and technology, \$150,000; (iii) Student and staff safety, security systems, and school resource officers, \$120,000; (iv) Additional staff and insurance coverage, \$55,000; (v) Literacy interventions and all-day kindergarten, \$50,000; (vi) Fine Arts including music, drama, instruments; FFA and athletics, \$50,000; for a total amount of \$700,000.

"Shall the Moreland Cemetery District, of Blackfoot, Bingham County, Idaho, be authorized and empowered to permanently increase the property tax levy as permitted by Section 63-802(1)(h), Idaho Code, in the amount of thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000), for the development and expansion of the cemetery to include: Maintenance and operation, installing new irrigation systems, creating new plots, building new roads, erecting new fences and planting new grass. The proposed permanent levy would begin the fiscal year starting October 1, 2024 provided by resolution of the Board of Trustees, Moreland Cemetery District, adopted on December 6, 2023."

"Shall the Board of Trustees of Snake River School District No. 52, Bingham County, State of Idaho, be authorized to levy a Supplemental Levy, in the amount of Seven Hundred Thousand and no/100 dollars (\$700,000) per year for two (2) years, commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2027, for the purpose of financing all lawful expenses of maintaining and operating the District; all as provided in the resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees on March 20, 2024?"

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer of the proposed levy would be a tax of \$11.37 per one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions.

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed levy is a tax of \$85 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. The proposed levy replaces an existing \$700,000 per year levy that will expire on June 30, 2025, and that currently costs \$85 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year. Therefore, if the proposed levy is approved, the tax per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value is not expected to change.
